Equal rights, opportunities, and greater personal freedom for women.










What is Ableism

The <u>systemic bias and discrimination</u> against people with disabilities. It reflects the negative image of people with disabilities that society has created. It also includes the <u>false assumption</u> that people with disabilities are less capable and depend on the charity of others. <u>Well-intentioned actions</u>, such as rushing to help a person in a wheelchair without asking, are often examples of this false belief.

How do we stop Ableism?

No cure

No scientific knowledge

No surgical procedure

We just need to recognize it!

No new drugs

All we need is for society (both institutions and individuals) to change behavior.



Social Model

Proposes that what makes someone disabled is not their medical condition, but the attitudes and structures of society.

Medical Model

Sees disability as something that is 'wrong' with a person's body or mind.



Third Wave Movement

Professionals Professionals make the decisions.



Parents Parents make the decisions.





The person decides for his/herself.

Disability Rights Advocacy

- Blocking traffic for accessible public transportation in New York;
- Protests demanding that there be a deaf president at Gallaudet University;
- Hunger strikes to bring attention to the rights of people with mental health issues;
- Blocking buses to demand that public transportation be made accessible in Chicago;
- Sit-ins in government offices until the government issued regulations for Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act


